**BPVS RECOMMENDED DEWORMING ROTATION**

<b>MONTH</b>	<b>DEWORMER</b>	<b>SOME BRAND NAMES</b>
<b>January/February</b>	Pyrantal Pamoate (double dose)	Strongid, Strongyle care
<b>March/April</b>	Ivermectin OR Oxibendazole	Ivercare, Equimectrin, Zimectrin, etc OR Anthelcide EQ
<b>May/June</b>	Moxidectin w/Praziquantal	Quest Plus, Combocare
<b>July/August</b>	Fenbendazole	Panacur, Safeguard
<b>September/October</b>	Ivermectin	Ivercare, Equimectrin, Zimectrin, etc.
<b>November/December</b>	Ivermectin w/Praziquantal	Equimax, Zimectrin Gold

This is an example for you to follow. It is designed to keep the parasites “guessing” by using a different class of wormer each worming period. You will make your worming program even more successful by rotating pastures if possible and cleaning up the manure in them on a daily basis. Sunlight and dryness kills parasite eggs so break up the piles and let the sun shine on them! Keep your manure pile as far away from the horses as possible.

A note on ivermectin and moxidectin – be careful using these products in very old and very thin animals – please call us if you have concerns before using, as we have seen some non-life threatening complications. Miniature horse owners should also be cautioned using Quest.
